

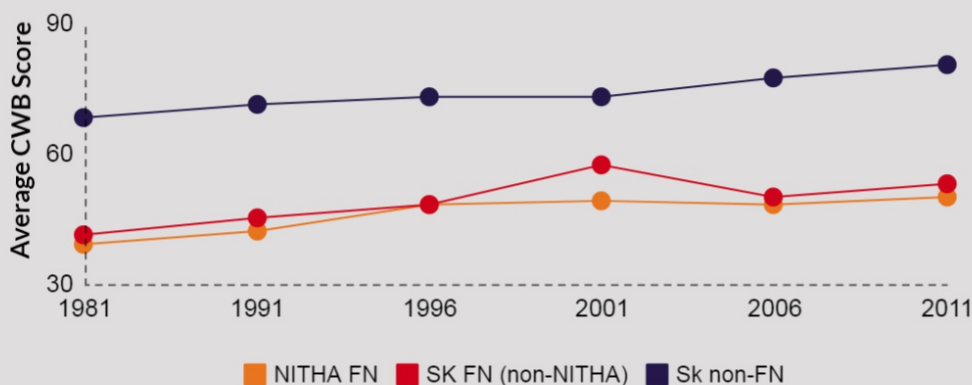
Community Well-Being Index

NITHA, 1981-2011

The Community Well-Being (CWB) index is a way of measuring socio-economic well-being at community level.

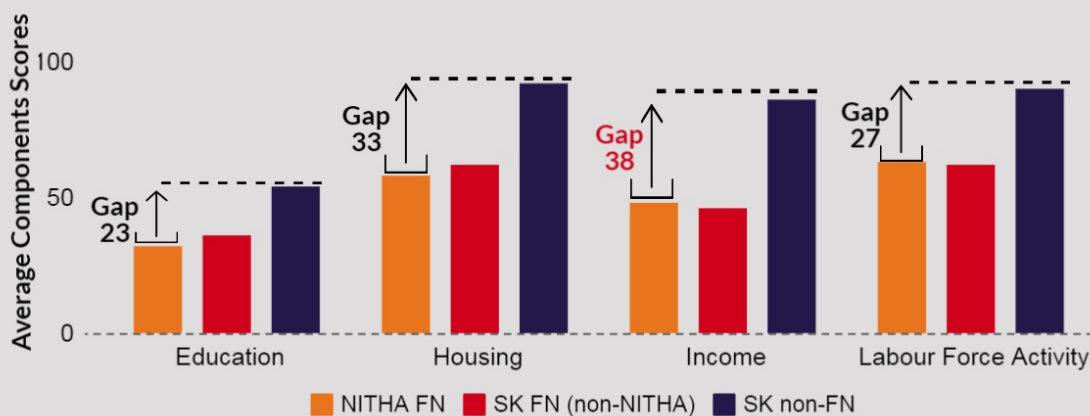
The CWB index combines data on income, education, housing and labour force activity into a well-being "score" for most of the communities across Canada.

CWB scores, 1981 - 2011



Between 1981 and 2011, on average, the non-FN communities' CWB index scores were between 24 to 30 points higher than FN communities in Saskatchewan.

CWB components scores, 2011



In 2011, the largest gap between NITHA and non-FN communities was in income (38 points)
