PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT:

Potential COVID-19 Exposure in Stanley Mission

Thursday, October 8, 2020 21:00HRS

Northern Inter-Tribal Health Authority (NITHA) public health officials are notifying the public of potential exposure to coronavirus (COVID-19) in Stanley Mission Health Center where a person attended during the following times while likely infectious:

- Monday October 5, 2020 8:00am 4:30pm
- Tuesday October 6, 2020 7:30am 4:30pm
- Wednesday October 7, 2020 8:00am 4:30pm

Public health officials are advising individuals who were at Stanley Mission Health Center during the specified dates and times listed above to immediately self-isolate if they have had or currently have symptoms of COVID-19 and to call HealthLine 811 or their community health clinic (306) 425-1720 to arrange for assessment and testing.

All other individuals who are not experiencing symptoms should self-monitor for 14 days from the date of last exposure. It is important to note that individuals may develop symptoms from two to 14 days following exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19.

The Stanley Mission Health Center is closed until 3pm Friday October 9, 2020. For emergency services please call (306) 635-7808 or dial 911.

Symptoms of COVID-19 can vary from person to person. Symptoms may also vary in different age groups. Some of the more commonly reported symptoms include:

- new or worsening cough
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- temperature equal to or over 38°C
- feeling feverish
- chills
- fatique or weakness
- muscle or body aches
- new loss of smell or taste
- headache
- gastrointestinal symptoms (abdominal pain, diarrhea, vomiting)
- feeling very unwell
