## PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT:

### Potential COVID-19 Exposure in Sturgeon Lake First Nation

**Friday, October 24, 2020 18:00HRS**

Northern Inter-Tribal Health Authority (NITHA) public health officials are notifying the public of potential exposure to coronavirus (COVID-19) in Sturgeon Lake Health Center where a person attended while likely infectious.

Public health officials are advising individuals who were at Sturgeon Lake Health Centre between October 11<sup>th</sup> and October 19<sup>th</sup> to self-monitor for any symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days from the last date they visited the clinic. These include: fever, cough, breathing difficulties, sore throat, runny nose, chills, diminished sense of smell, and body aches. If they develop any of those symptoms, they should self-isolate immediately and call HealthLine 811 to arrange for assessment and testing.

The health centre is closed for deep cleaning and will re-open Monday, October 26, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. Staff are prioritizing testing for individuals identified as close contacts.
