

Changes for Fully Vaccinated Individuals

Self-Isolation

- Those who are 14 days past their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine at time of exposure and are asymptomatic may be exempted from selfisolation if they are deemed a close contact of a COVID-19 positive person.
- The release from self-isolation does not apply to anyone with symptoms. Even if you have only relatively mild symptoms, you must immediately self-isolate.
- Anyone who has received only one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine must still self-isolate as directed by Public Health if they are named as close contacts.
- At this time, people must continue to self-isolate for 14 days following international travel, as per the <u>federal quarantine order</u>.

Testing

- If a fully vaccinated person is exposed to COVID-19 and remains asymptomatic, there is no requirement for COVID 19 testing.
- However, there is still a requirement for health care workers and employees/residents at facilities including long-term and personal care homes, corrections facilities and congregate living settings such as group homes and shelters to be tested, if they are deemed as a close contact of someone who is COVID-19 positive.
