

## Appropriate GLOVE USE



- Hand hygiene must be performed before putting on and after removing gloves.
- Change gloves and perform hand hygiene between each patient /resident.
- Ensure that you access supplies with clean hands.
- Do not re-use gloves or use alcohol based hand rub on them.
- Gloves must be changed between each task, even for the same patient/resident.

## **EXAMPLES OF INAPPROPRIATE GLOVE USE**



- IV insertion and removal
- Drawing blood
- Handling of drainage bags, bedpans for disposal or specimen collection, catheter care
- Handling/disinfecting dirty instruments
- Handling waste
- Cleaning up spills of blood or body fluids
- Handling chemicals



- Taking blood pressure, temperature and pulse
- Bathing and dressing
- Transporting a specimen if specimen is in a transport bag
- Transporting a patient/resident
- Charting or using the telephone
- Distributing dietary trays
- · Giving oral medications

## What Happens When HCWs Wear Gloves When They Are Not Required?

- Hand Hygiene opportunities are missed
- Increase in skin issues such as dermatitis
- Can cause an increase in cross transmission
- Waste of resources

Note: Gloves are not continuous use.
