

PBCN-EOC Update

EVACUATION ORDER FULLY RESCINDED

Peter Ballantyne Cree Nation Emergency Operations Centre is advising that the evacuation order has now been fully lifted, including for individuals classified as Priority 1 (P1) and Priority 2 (P2), for all of its communities.

All evacuees are now authorized and expected to return home.

S FINAL RETURN INSTRUCTIONS

- All evacuees, including P1s and P2s, must begin preparing to return home.
- Bus transportation is available and is being coordinated for safe return.
- All evacuees must check out of hotels and board the buses on Wednesday, June 11th.
- For those staying in hotels, costs will no longer be covered once return transportation is in place.
- Evacuees who choose to remain behind will be responsible for their own accommodations and costs.

I HEALTH & SAFETY

- While services remain limited, health supports and community infrastructure have improved enough to safely support the return of all members.
- Please ensure you have a two-week supply of medications before leaving. If needed, speak with nursing staff at your evacuation site.

!! NEW PBCN EMERGENCY REGISTRATION SYSTEM!!

PBCN has launched a new emergency registration system to track and support members during any emergency.

Even if you are returning home, you should still register, as more supports and resources will be available to registered members.

You can register in one of three ways:

A PLANNED POWER OUTAGES – JUNE 10, 11, & 12

SaskPower has confirmed a series of planned power outages that will affect communities during the repatriation period.

These outages are scheduled for:

- June 10, 11 & 12
- From 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM daily
- Affected areas include:
 - Pelican Narrows
 - Deschambault Lake
 - Jan Lake
 - Hansen Lake
 - · All surrounding rural areas

Please prepare accordingly—charge devices, stock water, and check on Elders or vulnerable members.

HEALTH SERVICES NOTICE FOR PELICAN NARROWS

- There are scheduled power outages over the next three days between June 10th, 11th and 12th between 9 am and 5 pm. This will impact the Health Centre, which will be closed for emergencies only.
- Ambulance service is also limited at this time due to staffing shortages
- The Flin Flon Hospital remains closed
- A Boil Water Advisory is in effect:
 - Please boil all water used for drinking, cooking, brushing teeth, or washing produce for at least one minute

NORTHERN STORE OPERATIONS & SUPPLIES

- The Northern Store in Pelican Narrows is open and expecting fresh supply deliveries.
- A refrigerator truck and a dry grocery truck are en route with essential items for the community.

NOTICE:

A pharmacist will be available at the Northern Store in Pelican Narrows tomorrow to assist with medication needs and refills for returning evacuees.

CHECKPOINT & SECURITY MEASURES FOR PELICAN NARROWS

Security checkstops will continue to be in place at the Pelican Narrows bridge to to support both wildfire-related safety operations and ongoing community security priorities.



CPS staff may:

- Request photo ID
- Ask brief screening questions
- Conduct vehicle checks if necessary
- All vehicles and adult occupants will be logged, including license plate numbers and times of entry.
- No sensitive personal information will be collected.
- These logs help monitor suspicious activity and individuals who may be barred from entering Pelican Narrows or nearby communities.

We ask everyone to be respectful and cooperative with staff stationed at the checkstops.

GAS FOR PRIVATE VEHICLES (Pelican Narrows and Birch Portage)

Evacuees returning in private vehicles should fuel up in advance. Gas is available at:

- 1. Petro-Canada Prince Albert
 - 1202 2nd Avenue West, Prince Albert, SK
- 2. Kahkewistahaw Gas & Convenience Saskatoon
 - 2150 Markham Road #10, Saskatoon, SK
- 3. Regina Area
 - Contact your local evacuation site coordinator to obtain a gas card prior to departure
