The Healing Through Commitment honour recognizes an outstanding Community TB Worker whose dedication, compassion, and unwavering commitment strengthen TB care delivery within their community.

Community TB Workers hold one of the most demanding and essential roles in treatment success. They administer life-saving medication 365 days a year in homes, workplaces, and clinics ensuring that individuals receiving TB treatment are supported consistently and respectfully throughout their journey.

Beyond medication delivery, they serve as a trusted link between clients and healthcare teams. They help address barriers to care, assist with social challenges, coordinate follow-up with nurses and physicians, and often provide the only consistent connection to healthcare for some individuals and families.

## This distinction honours those who:

- Demonstrate exceptional reliability and accountability in Directly Observed Therapy (DOT)
- Build trusting, respectful relationships within the community
- Advocate for clients and families
- Strengthen collaboration between community and healthcare systems
- Protect future generations by helping prevent the spread of TB
